Mike Myher reported that he has been in touch with the Pinckney School Board via email. They are not interested in our offer of \$100,000 for Pinckney Elementary.

Bob Brumm attended the Pinckney School Board meeting on June 5. They had two letters of intent to purchase the building. They rejected the first one. The second one, from a group in Howell that would build housing was accepted. The School Board Chairman stated that they would prefer to sell the property for housing.
