AS WE GATHER

Today we hear about the "fishing hook" that God used to attract Isaiah as His prophet. Along with Isaiah, we, too, are moved to respond, "Here am I! Send me." Like the Apostle Paul, we have a "line" to reel in people who might otherwise stray from the LORD. We are called to speak clearly about the task of "building up the church." But we are not called to introduce them to a "sinker" who will weigh them down, for Jesus has risen! Now He sets us up to "fish" for others, replacing their empty lives with God's overflowing, eternal bounty. Today we let the Word move us into action, to use the "hook and line" that God provides to follow our Lord and catch others for the One who has risen above our every weighty sin and empty life and calls us to follow. Are we ready to go fishing?

- In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of His robe filled the temple. Above Him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one called to another and said:
- "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory!"

SERMON Fish Where the Fish Are! Luke 5:1-11

CONFESSION OF FAITH

Explanation to the $Third\ Article\ of\ the$ Apostle's Creed

- Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
- P What does this mean?
- I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.
- In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.
