As We Gather

Sainthood isn't limited to those "heroes of faith" from the past who have died and gone to heaven. Sainthood is granted by God Himself to any common, salt-of-the-earth person who simply trusts in Jesus Christ. Words matter. The gospel message is that God the Son came to earth, lived a perfectly obedient life, died on the cross to pay for our sins, and rose again, proving His atoning work was complete. Scripture says that the person of faith actually becomes the very righteousness of God! Through a living

faith, we become united to Christ – the source of salvation - , and we are saved from God's judgment as well as from the futile way of life that we naturally follow.
