AS WE GATHER

Our worship service today is a "relaxation" from normal Lenten discipline and sadness. Today's service is inspired by the Old Testament Reading of Isaiah, the First Song of Isaiah: "Sing praises to the LORD, for He has done gloriously; let this be made known in all the earth" (Isaiah 12:5). So today we take that admonition literally as not only the liturgy is sung but also the Scripture Readings are expanded with hymn stanzas. "Shout, and sing for joy, O inhabitant of Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel" (Isaiah 12:6). In the joy of the faithful father in Jesus' parable of the Prodigal Son, the amazing forgiveness of our sin and acceptance with God as His baptized sons and daughters ... Well, it just makes you want

to sing! And so ... that is exactly what we will do today!
